Advent

Carl Houselander wrote that "Advent is the season of the seed. Christ loved this symbol of the seed. The seed, he said, is the Word of God sown in the human heart."

The idea that the power which made the universe and everything in it could reduce itself to an infinitesimally small cluster of cells in the womb of a human woman, is truly, to use the language of Saint Paul, a scandal – skandalon – and not just to the Greeks. It is clinging to this ineffable, impossible mystery, that defines the life of faith.

While Advent only takes around four weeks, in those weeks the Church invites us to re-run all the events of that extraordinary conception and gestation. We need to hear the Word speak of himself, in order to remember who we ourselves are called to be. As Ann Voskamp says the word "conceive" is not in fact "passive, but an active verb." And "it's root in Latin means nothing less that to *seize*, to *take hold of*. When grace conceives in you, you take hold of God."

Here then is the paradox of our religion. That God reaches out from his ineffable glory into the very heart and flesh of our humanity. He comes into being as a man who walks among us, teaching, healing, and showing us what love truly is: to the point of giving his life into the heart of darkness that is fallen humanity. The Word and the seed become one: God with us, Emmanuel, the face we seek, made visible at last in the features of a newborn.

Master of both the light and the darkness, send your Holy Spirit upon our preparations for Christmas.

We who have so much to do and seek quiet spaces to hear your voice each day.

We who are anxious over many things look forward to your coming among us.

We who are blessed in so many ways long for the complete joy of your kingdom.

We whose hearts are heavy seek the joy of your presence.

We are your people, walking in darkness, yet seeking the light.

To you we say, "Come Lord Jesus!" Amen.
