May – the month of Our Lady

One hundred and five years ago, on 13 May 1917, our Lady appeared to three children in Fatima, Portugal. Frightened by her appearance, she calmed them by saying: "Please don't be afraid of me, I'm not going to harm you." In addition to her call for conversion, penitence, and prayer, Our Lady of Fatima calls us to live a life free from all fear.

We might think that the children at Fatima were naturally skittish and so were afraid when they saw the vision of the Blessed Mother, but even adults show fear when confronted with God. It does seem strange perhaps that the deepest desire of our heart, that is, to be united with God for ever in heaven, would cause us fear, but yet we know this to be the case when we avoid sacramental confession, the sacrifices necessary for an intense prayer life, or even the abandonment of our sins. We are afraid to change, we are afraid to lose ourselves, and we are even afraid to lose any pleasure in our life.

St John in his First Letter reminds us: In love there can be no fear, but fear is driven out by perfect love: because to fear is to expect punishment, and anyone who is afraid is still imperfect in love (1Jn 4:18)

The children of Fatima were comforted by Mary saying, "I have come from heaven." Hopefully, we are comforted as well, since that, after all, is where we hope to live in love for ever, free from all fear.
