The ASCENSION

Erasmo Leiva-Merikakis (Brother Simeon: Cistercian monk of Spencer, MA)



The Ascension contains the great mystery of why Jesus must visibly leave his disciples, thus creating a physical void in their midst. What they most greatly love – their Risen Master – can no longer be seen, heard, or touched.

Before departing "to Heaven" (the place from which power will come), he blesses them with the hands that show the wounds of the cross. As blood had poured out of them forty days before, now light and blessing pour from them as Jesus' final, visible deed on this earth. This even marks a major turning point in the story of Jesus' relationship with mankind, because this blessing is as if Jesus were saying to them: "I leave for heaven so that your own hands may now become my hands, your deeds my deeds, your heart my heart." How else can we explain their great joy in returning to Jerusalem?

The promise of the Holy Sirit and the blessing by Jesus' hands have communicated the certainty to them that, even in leaving them visibly, he is not abandoning them but rather making room interiorly for them to be what they have seen him to be – by now having the same Father as he and the same Spirit animating their lives. They must now themselves *become* what they have learned to admire and love.

In other words, Jesus now ceases to be but one person in one physical body among many in the world so that the Church corporately and in every individual member can become the presence of his Body on earth. Jesus disappears as single

individual in order to fill the whole world with his presence. From now on, those who want to see Jesus, the Messiah, will have to look to the Church and her members – for better or for worse.

Helena of Constantinople and her son, Constantine the Great, to find the True Cross: the cross that is said to be the one upon which Jesus was crucified. It has since

become part of Filipino tradition focused on youth and their devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

MAY, THE MONTH OF MARY

One of the problems that many people have with Mary is that they try to put themselves back 2,000 years and imitate this person. Pope Paul V1 warns us against this.

The culture and life-style that Mary lived no longer exists to any degree, so it's not possible to imitate that. The challenge for us in not so much a question of our moving back 2,000 years, but rather of bringing Mary forward to our own day and trying to absorb her attitude of mind.

"Let us imitate our mother: she did not have people speak of her; the Gospel only named her four times and yet what good she did! And for us, let us have her spirit, let us do good as if hidden and unknown in the world."

The first word Mary uttered was "YES" to God as He revealed that she was to be the mother of our Saviour.

In the Old Testament, God gave ten commandments to His people. In the New Testament, Christ reduced these ten to two: "Love the Lord your God and love your neighbour as yourself." Even those two seem too hard for many of us. Mary has reduced these two to one command: "Do whatever He tells you." (John 2:5) This is why Mary is such a model for the Christian life. (Fr Colin SM)

The Jubilee Prayer

Father in heaven, may the *faith* you have given us in your Son, Jesus Christ, our brother, and the flame of *charity* enkindled in our hearts by the Holy Spirit, reawaken in us the blessed *hope* for the coming of your Kingdom.

May your grace transform us into tireless cultivators of the seeds of the Gospel. May those seeds transform from within both humanity and the whole cosmos in the sure expectation of a new heaven and a new earth, when, with the powers of Evil vanquished, your glory will shine eternally.

May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, *Pilgrims of Hope*, a yearning for the treasures of heaven. May that same grace spread the joy and peace of our Redeemer throughout the earth. To you our God, eternally blessed, be glory and praise for ever. Amen. (Papa Francesco)
